

# Keys to the Courthouse

Counties play a major role in the administration of *justice* in Texas. Each county's justice system is based on the county's size. If counties need special help to investigate criminal matters they can call upon the Texas Rangers. These are the components of county law enforcement.

If you think of the judicial system as having a pyramid shape, the **justice of the peace courts** would be the base. Justices of the peace have the authority to judge minor *civil* cases, to impose small fines (not more than \$200) for misdemeanors, and to hold preliminary hearings on more serious crimes. The justice of the peace court can function as a *small claims* court in disputes involving less than \$10,000. A justice of the peace can be a coroner, issue warrants, conduct investigations and preliminary hearings, and perform marriages. Periodic training is required to hold this office and the justice does not have to be an attorney.

The next level in the pyramid is the **county court**. The county judge presides over the county court. In rural areas, he or she is a judge in *criminal (misdemeanor* cases only), civil, *probate* and mental competency cases. County court has jurisdiction in civil cases involving small amounts of money.

In more populated counties, the state legislature has created **county courts-at-law** to relieve the county constitutional courts. In these counties, civil and criminal jurisdictions are transferred to the county courts-at-law. The courts-at-law judges must be licensed attorneys and are helped by the county clerk.



Are you a horse enthusiast? Do you consider yourself a leader among your peers? Do you want to be a part of something bigger than yourself? Do you want to take your 4-H horse project to the next level? Accept the challenge and apply to become a Texas 4-H Equine Ambassador!

The Texas 4-H Equine Ambassador program is designed as an in depth learning experience for selected youth to represent the equine industry in Texas. The 2013 training will be held in Gainesville on August 11-15. Training includes a short-course experience in the most heavily populated horse industry area of Texas. During this five-day training, more than 30 hours of rigorous instruction by industry professionals, university faculty, Texas A&M Agrilife Extension Specialist, and County Extension



Agents cover topics such as leadership, career development, horse care and training philosophies and Horse Industry advocacy.

#### Texas 4-H Horse Validation Opened March 1st on 4-H Connect

The 2013 Texas 4-H Horse Validation Process started March 1st on 4-H Connect and runs through April 15th at a cost of \$10 per horse. From April 16th to May 1st the cost increases to \$20 per horse. Validation is required for all horses that may be entered into either district or state horse shows. For those horses validated last year in 4-H Connect, you will need to re-activate and pay for validation. New horses you will need to provide photos of each side, and front, as well as a pdf copy of registration papers (if registered). #### Time to Clean the Scene

Your refrigerator is an important appliance! Make it the focus of your spring cleaning! Take steps to clean and sanitize refrigerator surfaces:

- First, throw away perishable foods in your refrigerator that should no longer be eaten. Refer to the cold storage chart.
- Remove refrigerator drawers and clean them with hot water and soap in the kitchen sink.
- Clean other interior refrigerator surfaces with hot water and soap, then rinse with water. Wipe dry with a clean cloth.
- After cleaning, use a diluted bleach and water solution (1 T liquid bleach to 1 Gal water) on shelves, drawers and other interior surfaces of the refrigerator.
- Clean the refrigerator's condenser coil with a brush or vacuum cleaner to remove dirt and lint. This can help your refrigerator operate more efficiently.

# Nutritious Snacks For Kids!!

#### **Fruitsicles**

#### **Ingredients:**


- 3 cups 100% fruit juice (apple, orange, grape, etc.)
- 1 cup canned fruit in natural juices (cocktail, pears, peaches, apricots, etc.)

#### **Equipment:**

- Measuring cups
- Food mill or grinder, blender, food processor
- Disposable 5-ounce cups (5-ounce size, 8 each)
- Popsicle sticks (8 each)
- Plastic wrap

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Pour juice and canned fruit into blender, food mill, or processor
- 2. Mix juice and fruit together and pour 4 ounces (1/2 cup) into paper cups
- 3. Cover with plastic wrap, slit a hole in center of wrap, and insert popsicle stick into hole
- 4. Freeze until hard
- 5. Tear away cup to eat
- 6. Serve one paper cup per child

#### **Mexican Beans**

#### **Ingredients:**

- Seasoning Blend (onions, green pepper, celery, bits of red pepper, , fajita seasoning works too)
- ♦ 2 cans Pinto Beans (substitute 1 can each of Ranch Style Plain and Ranch Style Jalapenos for more spice)
- ◆ Crushed tomatoes (Great Value brand from Walmart is 28 oz and perfect consistency)
- Extra green peppers if desired

#### **Directions:**

#### Combine:

- Blob of olive oil about 4" wide in pan/pot
- ♦ 1 cup of seasoning blend
- ♦ 1/3 cup green peppers (optional)
- Crushed tomatoes
- ♦ 2 cans of beans, drained

#### Stir the mix completely then add:

- ♦ 1 tsp chili powder
- ♦ 1/2 tsp garlic salt
- ♦ 1/4 tsp cumin

Mix well and simmer.

Let set overnight in fridge to make the flavor even better.
