One key service provided by counties is the veterans' services office. This office coordinates pensions, loans, transportation and other services for veterans and their families.

A county has to decide where to put trash—either to keep it in the county or pay to ship it to a landfill somewhere else. Some counties operate solid waste departments and provide waste disposal for citizens and businesses throughout the county. The service may also be offered to municipalities within the county. Rather than operating their own solid waste departments, some counties contract with private companies that provide this service. A county enforces laws against the illegal dumping of trash.

Provisions from the American Disability Act will be considered when planning educational programs and activities. 



Ingredients:


- 1/2 cup peanut butter (creamy)

Peanut Butter Cereal Bars

Ingredients:

- 3 cups Mini Marshmallows
- 3 Tbsp Butter or Margarine
- 1/2 cup reduced fat peanut butter
- 3 1/2 cups crisp rice cereal
- 1 cup quick oats
- 1/3 cup mini semisweet chocolate chips

Microwave Directions:

- 1. Spray 13X9 inch baking pan with nonstick cooking spray
- 2. Combine marshmallows and butter in large microwavable bowl. Microwave on high 15 seconds, stir. Microwave 1 minute, stir until marshmallows are melted and mixture is smooth. Add peanut butter, stir. Add cereal and oats-stir until well coated. Spread into prepared pan. Immediately sprinkle chocolate chips on top and lightly press into cereal mixture. Cool completely in pan. Cut into 40 bars.
