General Rules and Regulations**

- Participants must abide by all applicable rules in the County Fair General Rules and Regulations.
- Participants must be a resident of and/or attending either a public, private, or home school in Orange County.
- Entries to be submitted online

Select Registration in the first tan box to the right of screen.

Select category to enter.

Food Division must have recipe submitted with entry.

- Every precaution to ensure the safety of the projects will be taken, but projects are ultimately the exhibitor's responsibility. By submitting your project to this competition exhibitor's are releasing Texas A&M AgriLife Extension and Orange County Livestock Show Association of liability for any damages that their items might incur during the course of the show.

- No "For Sale" signs will be permitted on exhibits.
- Winners will be announced at the Auction which begins at 7 pm Saturday, October 8, 2022. Items will remain at Arena until this time.
- The Project Contest Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules. Any rules questioned can be decided at the show by that division chairman and/or a quorum of the voting members of the committee. This interpretation will take precedent for the duration of the show. Final interpretation will be decided at the next regular meeting of the Project Contest Committee.
- All entries will receive a ribbon based on the quality of their project.
- Grand and Reserve Champion projects will be chosen from those that receive blue ribbons.
- Age division will be divided as follows:

Junior	Grades 3rd - 5th
Intermediate	Grades 6th - 8th
Senior	Grades 9th - 12th

FOOD DIVISION

Entries containing fresh fruit, cream cheese, sour cream, meat, seafood or any garnish that molds will not be judged unless they are cooked or baked into the food item. Cream, custard, meringue and chess pies will be disqualified and will not be judged. ***Hint: if the recipe says "keep refrigerated" you should not use it!***

Presentation

- Participants are allowed and encouraged to submit their projects in a decorative containers.
- No glass containers will be accepted except canning entries.
- While the Project Contest Committee takes all precautions to ensure that projects are not tampered with, exhibitors are also encouraged not to submit items in family heirlooms or containers with sentimental value due to the risk of damage.

All food entries must be edible.

Entries will be judged according to the following criteria.

- Recipe
- Presentation
- Texture and moisture - even grain, lightness, airiness
- Color & Taste - strength, flavor, quality.
- Education involvement - age appropriate, complexity

Items that will be accepted

- Cakes, Pies, Homemade Bread, Dried Foods and Canned Foods (2)
- Cupcakes One (1) dozen, Candies/Fudge One (1) dozen
- Cookies/Brownies One (1) dozen

INDUSTRIAL ARTS DIVISION

Project may have been constructed by either an individual or a group but must be only the work of those exhibitors designated in the entry.

Projects entered in this division must be either wood or small metalwork items (such as small BBQ pits) which are suitable for use in or around a home or office.

Projects are not required to be painted, stained or properly treated prior to entry, but are required to be completed in every other regard. Painted, stained or treated projects receive no advantage or preference over others.

Entries will be judged according to the following criteria:

- Workmanship
- Design and Material Used
- Usefulness and Practicality
- Finish or Preparation of Surface or Finish

FAMILY & COMMUNITY SCIENCE DIVISION

Items that will be accepted

- Fabric Skills
- Embellished Textiles
- Fiber Arts
- Home Decorating
- Personal Accessories
- Crafts

ART DIVISION

Items that will be accepted

- Drawings
- Paintings
- Picture Stories
- Ceramics
- Paper Mache
- Plaster
- Pottery
- Sculpture

PHOTOGRAPHY

Exhibitor should submit an 8 inch by 10 inch photo that has been matted or mounted on foam board.

No framed photos allowed.
